Applying for a Part-Time FE Fee Waiver

Fee-waiver applications must be completed and submitted online to Finance within the first 25% of the course duration.

How to Apply for a Fee Waiver

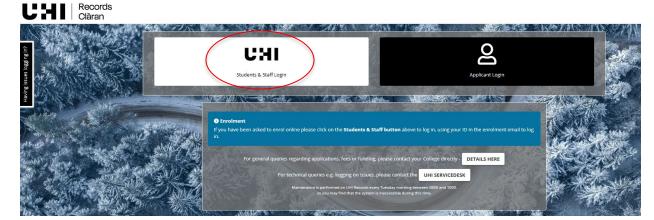
1. Sign in to MyDay

Go to MyDay and select the UHI Records tile.



2. Log in

On the next screen, choose Students & Staff Login.

3. Select Your Course

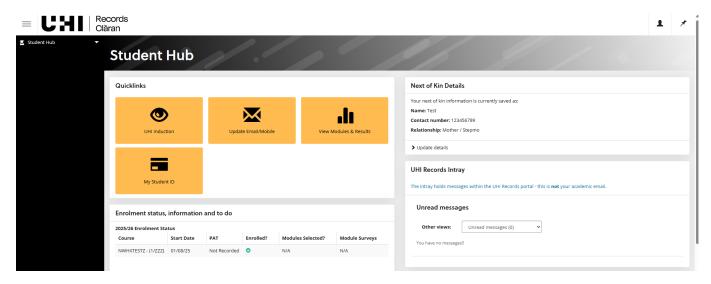
If you have studied with UHI before, you will see the option to select your course.





4. Access the Student Hub

This takes you to the Student Hub portal where you enrolled. Here, you will see details such as enrolment status, next of kin, modules, and results.



5. Start the Application

Scroll down and find 'FE Part-Time Fee Waiver' on the right-hand side. Click Start to begin your application.



6. Complete the Application

Read the introduction before proceeding.

Follow the prompts, selecting the options that apply to your circumstances and income.

FE Part Time Fee Waiver - Introduction

General Information

This form must be submitted to student records before the first 25% of the course has been completed. Please check with college staff for this date.

There is no upper/lower age limit on a student's eligibility for fee waiver.

Fee waiver cannot be claimed for Commercial or New Deal courses.

Limits to Fee Waiver Grant

Additional part-time activity over and above full-time study will not be eligible for a fee waiver grant.

Students taking two or more part-time courses will be eligible for a maximum of one full-time fee waiver. This equates to the following:

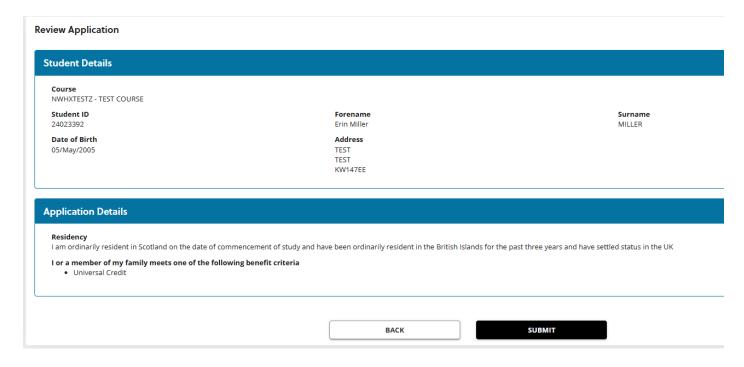
- the FE fee of £1,008 for students taking FE courses
- . the FE fee of £1,008 for students taking a mix of FE and part-time HE courses (fee waiver only applicable on FE element)

8. Check Your Application Status

After submission, return to the Student Hub screen. The status will show as 'Waiting Decision', which means your application has been received by Finance and will now be reviewed.

If all supporting documents are provided and your application is approved, the status will change to 'Awarded'. The fee waiver will be applied, and you will not be invoiced for your tuition fees.
